Help staying in your home

Hennepin County Front Door (612) 348-4111 Intake for home based waiver services, PCA, clean up, and other social services designed to help residents remain independent.

The Office of Multi Cultural Services (612) 348-2193 provides help for residents for whom English is not their first language. They provide support for housing, interpreting, applying for benefits, immigration issues and community referrals that are culturally appropriate.

Hennepin County Social Services Navigators (612) 543-5500 Short term help for applying for benefits and more

Community Action Partnership of Hennepin County (952) 933-9639 or caphennepin.org provides energy and water assistance. They also provide many other resources for low income households. Some financial assistance may also be available for rent

VEAP (952) 888-9616 or veap.org for the food pantry, mobile food pantry, and some financial assistance

Finding Housing

Housing Link Housinglink.org is a resource for housing searches. This site also contains information on which public housing waiting lists are currently open. Housing Link also offers help to people with complicated backgrounds that have difficulty finding housing. The program is called Beyond Background.

Minneapolis Public Housing mphaonline.org is currently taking applications for elderly, near elderly, and disabled individuals. The family wait list is closed.

Coordinated Entry is a process for assessing people who are homeless for several supportive housing programs. Shelter residents are typically screened at the shelter. Single adults staying outside, in cars, or other places not meant for habitation contact <https://www.hennepin.us/coordinated-entry> and click the access tab. Families staying outside, in cars, or places not meant for habitation can call the Front Door for an assessment (612) 348-4111
